What does creativity and culture mean to you?

The expression of words! I find it very therapeutic to use the spoken word and did a compilation of poems after my wife died.

I live by myself and it was a way to keep my mind occupied.

And then I found I was good at it!

How does taking part in creativity and culture impact your life?

When I lost my wife, I did not have anybody and no close family. It's important to mix and mingle - there is nothing worse than coming home to an empty house. Composing and performing poetry lets me reach out to lots of people with my positive vision. I perform to people with dementia, community groups, and open mic nights in local pubs. I don't read my poetry as I have memorised all my poems to make them flow better. I like it when people smile and clap, I get a lot of pleasure out of expressing myself. It makes me happy!

What is your most creative achievement?

It was a big milestone to write my first poem. I was inspired by a greyhound derby. It was a packed stadium and I wanted to convey what that was like to people that couldn't attend. I like performing live at open mic as I can put feeling behind my words when I stand up there and do it.

What would you recommend to someone that had not done anything creative or cultural for a while?

Join Tech Buddies [with Age UK Oxfordshire] - you need to move on with the future. I had no computers at school and I didn't use them for my carpet business. I've got a laptop now and Tech Buddies have helped me get on Zoom and upload my poetry videos to YouTube.
